**CHAPTER 9 ANIMAL CONTROL Article I. General Provisions**

Section 9-1-1. Cruelty to Animals. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to torture, torment, cruelly beat, mutilate, cruelly kill, override, overload, confine in

a vehicle in warm weather, intentionally abandon or inflict any unnecessary cruelty upon any animal. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person having charge, custody or control of any animal, either as owner or otherwise, to inflict any unnecessary cruelty on, or to fail to provide the necessary food, water and shelter to any such animal. This section shall not apply to the dehorning of cattle and normally accepted husbandry practices, nor to the use of animals in connection with medical or scientific teaching or research. (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to set out upon any property within the corporate limits of the City of Luverne or its police jurisdiction any stakes, pits, snares, traps, poison or other device or substance capable of causing hurt, injury or death to any domestic animal. The fact that such device or substance is found or located on such land shall be prima facie evidence that the same was set by the person in charge or control of such land. (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully instigate, promote, engage in, conspire with others, or do any act towards the furtherance of any act of cruelty to any animal. Section 9-1-2. Animal and Fowl Fights Prohibited.

Any person who fights any chickens, dogs or other fowls or animals, or who causes them to be fought, in this city or its police jurisdiction, or who is concerned or engaged in such fight or who bets or hazards any money or thing of value on the result of such fight shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Section 9-1-3. Protection and Regulation of Certain Animals.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person in the City or in its police jurisdiction to trap, shoot, hunt, molest, attempt to shoot, attempt to molest, or have in his possession any wild animal, except those excluded from protection by state law, or to take or willfully destroy the den of any such animal, except as permitted by state law. (b) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to display, sell, give away, offer for sale, advertise, barter or exchange any baby rabbits, baby chicks, ducklings or other baby fowl (but not including parrots, parakeets, canaries or other exotic birds normally sold as pets or novelties, regardless of whether or not such rabbits or fowl are dyed, colored or otherwise artificially treated. (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or maintain within the city any vicious, dangerous or poisonous animal or reptile, except when kept confined in an enclosure or cage approved by the Luverne Police Department. Such cage or enclosure shall be sufficiently secure to prevent the escape of such animal and to prevent access by persons other than the keeper, and shall not be kept or maintained within 500 feet of any public park, playground, public building or residence of another. This section shall not apply to any commercial or scientific establishment which keeps such animals for business or scientific purposes, nor

to the premises of any veterinary hospital, provided such establishments provide adequate security and protection for such animals. Section 9-1-4. (a) Any person owning, controlling or having care or custody of any animal shall take such reasonable and necessary precautions as required to protect all persons from physical harm from such animal, and to protect the private property of any other person. Article III. Livestock, Rabbits, and Fowl Section 9-2-1. Terms Defined.

Whenever used in this article, unless a contrary intention is clearly evident, the following terms shall be interpreted as herein defined: (a) The term "animal" shall mean and include any horse, hog, cow, sheep, rabbit, goat or any other animal of the equine, swine, bovine, ovine, or hare type of family; provided, however, that the use of the word "animal" in any section of this article shall not be construed as permitting the keeping of any hog or other animal of the swine type. (b) The term "enclosure" shall mean the entire housed or fenced area where animals or fowl are confined. (c) The term "fowl" shall mean and include chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, guineas, quail, pheasants and other fowl; provided, that the word "fowl" shall not include mynah birds, cockatiels, canaries, parakeets, parrots or any small bird kept in the house as a pet or for ornamental purposes. (d) The term "health officer" shall mean the county health officer of Crenshaw County and his authorized agents. (e) The term "person" shall mean and include the individuals, corporations, firms, partnerships and associations. The singular shall include plural, and the masculine, the feminine and neuter. (f) Animals or fowl kept at or on the premises of any veterinary hospital operated by a duly licensed veterinarian. (g) Baby fowl such as baby chickens transported into the city for selling purposes or kept within the city for selling purposes. (h) Animals or fowl kept at or on the premises for any laboratory, hospital or scientific institution for scientific purposes. (i) Animals with circuses, carnivals, fair, rodeos, horse shows or other animal shows operating within the city, which have been issued a permit by the City of Luverne. (j) Horses or animals of like kind kept by a public or private riding club or by any person or group of persons for riding or show, provided at least one person is employed on a full-time basis to clean the premises, and provided further that a permit for such keeping shall first be obtained, such permit to be granted on application to, and inspection by, the City of Luverne. (k) Animals or fowl kept on the premises of the animal shelter operated by the local humane society and impounded by an animal control officer as provided in this code or state law. Any person who keeps any animal or fowl in the city or in that area of the police jurisdiction within one thousand (1,000) feet of the corporate limits, by virtue of the exceptions set out in this section, shall be held responsible for the compliance with all of the sanitary and

other requirements of this article, and shall be subject to all of the requirements and controls provided in this article. Article IV. Dogs Section 9-3-1. Terms Defined. Whenever used in this article, unless a contrary intention is clearly evident, the following terms shall be interpreted as herein defined: (a) The term "dog" shall mean and include all domesticated members of the canine family, of either sex, of any age, whether or not vaccinated against rabies as required by law. (b) The term "vicious dog" or "dangerous dog" shall mean and include any dog known to have attacked any person or any animal or fowl without provocation. (c) The term "person" shall mean and include individuals, corporations, firms, partnerships and associations. The singular shall include plural, and the masculine, the feminine and neuter. (d) The term "owner" shall mean and include any person having a right of property in the dog, or who keeps or harbors a dog, or who has it in his care, or acts as its custodian, or who permits a dog to remain on or about any premises occupied by him. (e) The term "enclosure" means the entire housed or fenced area where a dog or dogs are confined and also means the area where a dog or dogs are tied, chained or tethered. Section 9-3-2. Dogs Running at Large Prohibited. (a) It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to allow or permit such dog to be at large, unconfined or able to travel on public property or the property of another in the City of Luverne unless such dog is restrained by a leash, rope or chain of not more than ten (10) feet in length, and of sufficient strength to control the actions of such dog. (b) It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to tie, chain or tether a dog such that it has access to public property or the property of another without the consent of the owner of such property. (c) It shall be no defense for a violation of this section that such dog was at large without the knowledge, consent or permission of the person charged with such violation. Section 9-3-3. Bitches in Season and Vicious or Dangerous Dogs Running at Large Prohibited. (a) It shall be unlawful for the owner of any female dog to permit such dog, while she is in season, to be at large or unconfined in the city or its police jurisdiction, upon any street or public place or upon the private premises of another without the consent of the person in charge or control of such private premises. (b) It shall be unlawful for the owner of any female dog, while she is in season, to have such dog confined in such a manner as to allow access to her by other animals. (c) It shall be no defense in any prosecution for violation of subsections (a) and (b) that such female dog was at large or that other dogs had entered the area of confinement without the knowledge, consent or permission of the persons charged with such violation.

(1) The boundary of such enclosure shall be not less than one thousand (1,000) feet from any church, school, public building, park, public playground or residence of another is located within the corporate limits. (2) Such enclosure shall be maintained in accordance with sanitary requirements provided in section 9-2-3 Section 9-2-5. Exceptions Relative to Place Where Keeping Prohibited. The restrictions provided herein, insofar as they apply to the place where any animal or fowl may not be kept in the city or in the police jurisdiction, shall not apply to the following: (a) Animal or fowl slaughterhouses licensed under a permit by the county health department. (b) Animals or fowl kept at or on the premises of any veterinary hospital operated by a duly licensed veterinarian. (c) Baby fowl such as baby chickens transported into the city for selling purposes or kept within the city for selling purposes. (d) Animals or fowl kept at or on the premises for any laboratory, hospital or scientific institution for scientific purposes. (e) Animals with circuses, carnivals, fair, rodeos, horse shows or other animal shows operating within the city, which have been issued a permit by the City of Luverne. (f) Horses or animals of like kind kept by a public or private riding club or by any person or group of persons for riding or show, provided at least one person is employed on a full-time basis to clean the premises, and provided further that a permit for such keeping shall first be obtained, such permit to be granted on application to, and inspection by, the City of Luverne.
